Wisconsin State USBC Women's Bowling Association Annual Meeting Delegates Report March 12 - 14, 2010 Ho-Chunk Hotel, Baraboo, WI

Friday evening the Wis. Women Bowling Writers held their 35th annual meeting. Awards were presented to winners of the poster (two categories), photography, and writing contests (two categories).

Membership now stands at 138, with nine charter members. New this year was the bowling writers mail-o-graphic tournament for the Susan B. Komen foundation. I received the second place award for submitting 14 entries from the Northernette League.

After the writers, the Wis. Women's 500 Bowling Club met. The membership is now 962, due in part to the great interest in the state 500 club tournament. 600 club members are now welcome to join the 500 club. For a one time membership fee of ten dollars you can be a part of this great organization. The next tournament will be at Strike Zone in Tomah, from October 2 - 17, 2010.

Saturday morning the 600 club met. Someday I may get to be a member! Their tournament will be held at Rose Bowl Lanes in Marshfield on weekends from Oct. 30 to Nov. 21, 2010.

At 10:00 am the WS USBC WBA convened its annual meeting. President and Hall of Fame awards were presented, first time 300 and 800 were introduced, and the Woman of Distinction award was presented. President Kandy Birmingham announced that 300 game and 800 series awards will now be a crystal bowling pin, and plaques will be given instead of emblems for tournament participation awards.

Manager Pat Tebon stated that our membership as of 01-01-10 is 34,199 according to bank deposits submitted by USBC. This is down 8%, but is misleading, as37,949 memberships were submitted. USBC says they're having a 'little' problem, and are working on a solution.

The 2011 tournament will be held in Central Fox Valley at Super Bowl and Sabre Lanes. This year's tournament in Green Bay is going great, and Wisconsin is again number one in tournament entries.

The membership approved a by-law amendment to change the number of delegates

and alternates an association is entitled to. The new criteria is:

1-100 membership	2 delegates
101-200 "	4 delegates
201-500 "	6 delegates
501-1000 "	7 delegates
1001 and up "	8 delegates

Jeannette Kneppreth scholarships were awarded to six young bowlers. One of them was Kayla Klug from Green Bay. Next year seven awards will be presented. The youth does not need to be a bowler to apply, but must be a relative of a bowler.

Judy Engelbrecht presented the state delegates report from the national convention in Reno. According to USBC, Bowl.com has improved navigation and was well worth the money (anyone trying to get info from this site would say differently). They are also setting up a virtual membership page similar to Facebook. USBC's priority issues are the youth Bowlopolis program, sport bowling, expanding the coupon program, and the PBA experience.

WS USBC WBA gives awards to each assn. for high game and series, high average, as well as 300, 700, and 800 awards. They also present high average league awards, president and assn. manager years of service awards. For ten dollars for three years bowlers may subscribe to the state newsletter, Bowling Action. They provide hall of fame certificates, JKS scholarships, workshops and seminars, annual meeting, and the state and senior tournaments.

After the memorial service, committee reports were given and elections were held. The meeting closed at 4:30 PM.

Oil patterns could impact bowlers' averages

s I mentioned in last week's column, the U.S. Bowling Congress is coming out with an array of oil patterns for next season that may cause some problems with tournament averages.

Seasoned league bowlers may be aware that bowlers who compete on the much tougher "sport" condition will have their lower averages recalculated upward for tournaments. The three new shots, dubbed the Red, White and Blue, will be tougher than "house" conditions, but more forgiving than the "sport" pattern.

The conundrum is: Do you give bowlers who use the new conditions an average compensation at the Wisconsin State USBC Tournament? The State Bowling Association is leaning toward "no," because the shot used at the tournament (more than four units of oil on the outside and 42 feet down the lanes) is in somewhat the same category as the proposed patterns.

State manager Phil LaPorte reported that as a member of the national USBC Restructuring Committee, he came in contact with a movement to eliminate local bowling associations. After a concerted effort to demonstrate the importance of locals, the move was dropped from the agenda. Meanwhile, the Wisconsin State Women's Bowling Association continues





to resist merging with the state USBC, although some progress is being made.

On Saturday night, the Wisconsin State USBC Hall of Fame Banquet commemorated the induction of Don Cook of Milwaukee and Rich Wonders from Racine.

Cook was named Wisconsin Bowler of the Year in 1986 after winning the singles and allevents titles at the state tournament. He also won the doubles event at the ABC National Tournament in the same year.

Wonders, proprietor of Hillside Lanes in Racine, was named the Wisconsin Bowler of the Decade in 1970, as well as state Bowler of the Year in 1981 and 1982. Bowler's Digest and Bowler's Journal both named him as their Amateur Bowler of the Year for 1982. He won gold, silver and bronze medals competing in the FIQ Tournament of the Americas and Pan American Games.

Although I was tasked by a friend of mine to come back from the festivities with a bowling joke, I was unsuccessful. Longtime readers of my column may remember that I

previously examined the topic of why there are so many good golf jokes, but no bowling jokes. As I heard several times from attendees I queried at the Hall of Fame Banquet, there are lots of good bowling stories (99 percent of which cannot be repeated in this column), but no known bowling jokes.

My quest continues. Perhaps I'll e-mail the National USBC Headquarters to see if they have any ideas.

State tourney under way in Fox Valley

his weekend marked the opening of the 108th annual Wisconsin State Bowling Association Tournament, with the team event at Fox Valley Lanes in Neenah and singles and doubles events in Oshkosh. I attended the festivities as the Door County representative of the U.S. Bowling Congress.

Opening ceremonies were Saturday at the team event site, with the head of the Oshkosh Convention and Visitors Bureau welcoming bowlers to the area and presenting a check for \$5,000 to the state association tournament prize fund. Short welcoming speeches were also forthcoming from the president of the Oshkosh USBC, the mayor of Oshkosh and the proprietor of Fox Valley Lanes.

The mascot of the Oshkosh USBC, Tippy Ten Pin, also made an appearance, although the 6-foot-tall, fuzzy white bowling pin didn't have much to say.

Then it was time to choose Joe Bowler for 2010. The lucky kegler was Cliff Alt, the number four man on his team from Prairie Du Sac. Strangely enough, a teammate of his was chosen last year. With a 201 average, Alt donned the traditional cape and crown for the ceremonial first ball, threw his Burgundy Hammer light in the pocket and carried the rack for a strike. His reward: 10 golden dollar coins.

After a hearty lunch of pasta salad, turkey and gravy over white rice, vegetable medley and banana cake, we were off to the Best Western Bridgewood for the Wisconsin USBC annual meeting. We learned that Madison had been passed over for the 2010 and 2011 tournaments because of scheduling difficulties. Furthermore, one of only two houses in Racine large enough to host the event was inspected and found to be too run down to meet minimum standards. For that reason, the 2011 tournament will be hosted by the city of Waukesha.

The state association will award eight scholarships of \$1,000 each in Wisconsin and Upper Michigan this year. Five will be made available to youth leaders around the state, and three will go to





the top performers in high school leagues.

The Summer Jamboree will be in Manitowoc this year, and five relatively unimportant amendments were proposed and approved for the state bylaws.

Numbers for the regular tournament continue to be steady. A total of 2,375 teams bowled in Green Bay last year, and more than 2,300 are expected in the Fox Valley this season.

The Senior Tournament for bowlers age 55 and over continues to grow by leaps and bounds. It was singles and doubles only from 1982 to 1996, and over the next 13 years grew to 350 teams. That number is already at 375 for this season, and is expected to hit 400 before all is said and done in Clintonville.

However, a deficit is expected in the 2010 budget, meaning that entry fees for the regular tournament will go up \$1 each for 2011 to \$20 per event. All Events will remain at \$6. Still, the Wisconsin State Bowling Tournament has been the largest in the nation for six years running and this season should make it seven.



ifty years ago, the late Earl "The Pearl" Willems decided that folks in Sister Bay needed a winter attraction, so he spent \$75,000 converting a dance hall into a bowling alley.

"Everybody thought he was nuts!" recalls his son-in-law, Dick Daubner.

Everybody changed their minds when the lanes filled up with bowling leagues in 1959. Five nights a week the Sister Bay Bowl filled six lanes with men's and women's leagues, some nights running two shifts.

"People would come to watch bowling," remembers Earl's daughter Sharon, Dick's wife. "The alley was full of people."

Earl didn't have automatic pin-setting machines that first year. Instead, local boys were hired to manually load and drop the pins by pulling a string. Each boy was responsible for two lanes – and the care of his own shins.

"You had a space where you could swing your feet," Dick remembers. "You had to keep an eye on the lanes, and if both guys were throwing at

At the same time, Gibraltar School was consolidating the old village schools and adding activities. Girls sports, youth feeder programs, and new extra-curriculars were born, and suddenly parents had a lot more games to attend and practices to ferry kids to. There was a lot less room in the schedule for a night or two each week in the bowling alley.

Today the bowling season is 25 weeks long, down from 33, and it doesn't start until after Fall Fest. Sanctioned league play is down to five women's teams on Tuesdays, and one shift of men on Thursday nights.

Though the leagues aren't as full as they once were, Sharon says the lanes still serve a nostalgic purpose for thousands of visitors.

"They come in and decide to roll a game before dinner, or maybe after," she says. "Or they take their kids out. We probably have more open bowling than most bowling centers."

After 50 years, the old lanes are cracked, chipped, and stubborn, but as long as they can keep them functioning, Sister Bay can thank "Earl the Pearl" for giving them something to do.

into your shins." Dick instinctively rubbed his shins at the memory as he talked. "Boy did that hurt. And the heat! Oh was it hot back there."

For the third year, Earl installed automatic pinsetters, much to the relief of Sister Bay's young male population. Half a century later, those machines (which Earl bought used) are still setting 'em up for local rollers to knock back down. Lanes 1-4 remain the original lanes, while 5 and 6 have been replaced once.

By the mid-1960s, bowling was entrenched in Northern Door, going strong through the 1970s, but things began to change in the 1980s.

"When the drinking age went from 18 to 21, things changed a lot," Dick says. Softball leagues dwindled and disappeared, and bowling tailed off. Three years worth of young men and women couldn't hang out in the bars anymore.

But it wasn't just the drinking age. Tourism was booming, and the locals were getting busier. After a long summer of work, fewer people would commit to bowling leagues when September arrived.



A Changing Game

odern equipment has made a huge difference in bowling scores. A good ball once cost about \$30, but Lief Mickelson says some bowlers will spend \$300 - \$400 on a ball



today. Many bowlers have multiple balls for different situations, such as a spare ball for picking up a hanging 10-pin.

In 1993 Clay Hillary bowled the 10th perfect 300 game in Door County history, 27 years after Emery Larson bowled the first at the Sister Bay Bowl. There have been 57 perfect games rolled in the 16 years since. The first 800 series in Door County was recorded on Oct. 11, 1999, and there have been nine more since.

Equipment makes it difficult to compare bowlers today to those 30 years ago, so Dick and Mike Daubner say it's difficult to make a definitive list of the best regular bowlers to grace the lanes. A 192 average would have led the league two decades ago, Dick says, but today that score wouldn't even put you in the top 10. But an un-scientific poll of random bar patrons drinking cocktails and beer prodded by a reporter who likes lists produced the following names, in no particular order:

frame (Delmar "Pickle" Olson and Donny Dietrich, whose 299 came the week after he rolled his 300)

First Perfection

hen Emery Larson bowled the first perfect 300 game at the Sister Bay Bowl on Dec. 15, 1966, it was frontpage news in the *Door County Advocate*. Larson "employs a sharp breaking hook in his game," the story said.

Larsen had an inside advantage – he was the keeper of the lanes. As Earl Willems right-hand man he maintained the alley for 16 years, working after league play ever night. He actually learned how to take care of the lanes from his whipsmart son, John, whom Earl sent to the Brunswick Mechanics School in 1960. John was one of the Bowl's original pinsetters, and he came back and showed his dad how they worked.

In 50 years, the lanes at the Sister Bay Bowl have been the responsibility of just three men, Emery Larson, Dick Daubner, and now Mike Daubner. Emery taught Dick, and Dick taught his son, Mike.

In a testament to the early popularity of bowling, Emery's death in 1975 also merited front-page headlines in the *Advocate*. "300 bowler dead at 67," read the headline. Emery's claim to fame was sealed.

His ghost is still purported to frequent the lanes he cared for.

Three joining Door County Hall of Fame

hree bowlers will be inducted into the Door County USBC Hall of Fame during a banquet Saturday night at The Ladder House in Sturgeon Bay.

The inductees are the late Katie Kerscher, May Jutila and Al Wittenberg. All three are very deserving of the honor for both their performances on the lanes and for their service to Door County bowling.

A few tickets are still available for the ceremony at local bowling centers and from members of the USBC Board of Directors. The banquet starts at 7 p.m.

It has been more than a decade since the passing of Katie Kerscher, but she will be fondly remembered as a major contributor of her time and effort to the Door County Women's Bowling Association for

many years.

Kerscher was president of that group for nine years, vice president for two and a board member for many more. Fifteen seasons found her serving as our delegate to state association meetings, and four more as delegate to national meetings. She was the longtime secretary of the Odd Couples league at Apple Valley Lanes.

Kerscher bowled in Door County for more seasons than there are records to consult. She was a regular bowler in the women's county tournament, winning championships in the doubles event in 1960, 1965 and 1977. She took the allevents titles in back-to-back seasons in 1965 and 1966, and also finished second in singles and allevents in 1977. She was a

lifetime member of the 600 Club.

May Jutila is another longtime Door County bowler who has put up impressive numbers on the lanes while donating her time and talents to the local association.

Her career is dotted with big scores, including a series high of 666 rolled in the Apple Valley Classic league during the 2006-07 season. That same year, she rolled a 254 game. She also had a 255 during the 1992-93 season, 266 in 1998-99 and a personal best of 267 in 1994-95.

Jutila has carried a league average of 180 or better for 14 of the past 15 seasons and claims a county team event championship in 1997, as well as couples team titles in 2006 and 2008.

Her service record





includes 15 consecutive years on the Door County USBC board of directors and one of its precursors, the DCWBA. Jutila has been secretary of the Apple Valley Classic league for many seasons, as well as president of the Apple Dumplings couples league, state delegate in 2004 and member of several committees.

Al Wittenberg rounds out the list of inductees who have excelled both on and off the lanes.

Wittenberg was secretary of the Door County Bowling Association for five seasons, from 1986-87 through 1990-91. He also served for six years as secretary of the Sister Bay Tavern league, followed by another six in the same position for the Cherry Lanes Commercial.

While in the Commercial, he shot a perfect game on Jan. 6, 2000 — only the fifth perfect game in the house up to that time and 25th by a Door County bowler. His 779 series on Jan. 22, 1998, stands as the second-best ever recorded on those lanes.

Wittenberg sported the highest average in the Commercial for six seasons, including a 218 in 1998-99 that led the entire association. His 215 the season before ranked third overall and his 219 the year after was second best. He consistently ranked among the top bowlers

everywhere he competed, averaging 202 in 1985-86, when that was still really impressive.

Wittenberg was a member of the DCBA record five-man team series of 3387 set at Curly's Country Aire in the 1987 association tournament, as well as the championship Peninsula Pub team in 1993. He was doubles champion in 1994 and 2002, singles champ in 1996 and all-events winner in 1995. Wittenberg is, perhaps, the only bowler in Door County history to record a 700 series at Apple Valley. Worley's, Curly's, Cherry and the Sister Bay Bowl.

Heimbecher breaks county

here's a new king of the lanes in Door County.

Just two months after Mike Cuculi pushed the local bowling association record to 814, John Heimbecher moved it up another notch when he rolled an 823 series last Wednesday night in the Washout League.

Heimbecher is easy to pick out on the lanes for his powerful ball and unorthodox style. Developed since his earliest days as a bowler in local junior leagues, his delivery involves gripping the ball top and bottom with both hands and a fast approach that helps to generate speed.

John's father, Tom He-





imbecher, was a top local bowler when John was young, and the son's bowling in some ways pays homage to the "cupped" delivery he saw used by his dad.

The results have been impressive: John Heimbecher holds the all-time junior scoring mark for Door County, shot a 771 series earlier this season and now has added the overall series record, as well.

Interestingly, Heimbech-

er's record series came without a perfect game. He rolled 276, 268 and 279. Having thrown 30

strikes out of 35 balls. there was some discussion afterwards about how moving a couple of nine counts around can make the small difference between rolling an 800 and setting a new record. Besides staying "clean" for all three games, two nine counts and a seven count came during the meat of the games, while the other two nines were fill-balls in the 11th and 12th. Put just one of those non-strikes somewhere else, and the total may have fallen a pin or two short of Cuculi.

Cuculi rolls 300, sets county record with 814 series

ike Cuculi had quite a night in the Apple Valley Major bowling league last Tuesday.

The Door County USBC Hall of Famer rolled a 300 game, had an incredible 23 strikes in a row and broke the county series record with an 814.

After ringing a 10-pin in the first frame of his first game on lanes 11-12, Cuculi ran 'em off the page for a 290 game.

The 290 was part of the second highest five-man team game in association history — a 1,287 by the Apple Valley Pro Shop team that fell just eight pins short of the 1,295 rolled by C&W Auto in 2001. Teammates Adam Kring (273), Al Wittenberg (225), Doc Bundy (241) and Pat Cuculi (258) beat the Red Room by 123 pins despite a 278 from Scott Voeks, 257 by Andy Alger, 244 by T.J. Lauten-

bach and 235 from John Moore.

Although most everyone else cooled off from there, Cuculi kept going. I didn't observe all of his shots during his second game, but I know the last six strikes were absolutely solid. His perfect game was the seventh of his career and number 67 in the local association.

Cuculi's 590 two-game score ranks as the top consecutive games in county history, besting a 573 (276-297) shot by Geoff Hansen earlier this year in the association tournament.

Cuculi also rolled 300 games in his first career 800 series (an 802 on Feb. 3) and on Jan. 11, 1995, as part of his then-record 795. Needing "only" a 210 final effort for a second 800 and 215 for the county record, it seemed Cuculi was well on his way to a truly memo-





rable night.

However, his third game showed just how little room for error there is when shooting a record high bowling score.

Cuculi left another 10-pin in the first frame and missed the spare. A strike, a spare and a double over the next four frames seems at first like a solid performance, but it still left him at just 95 through the beer frame — and that was before near-disaster struck in the form of a big split in the sixth.

As a bowler, you hate to waste a great start by throwing a mediocre (or worse) third game. And, as talented as Cuculi is, 590 starts don't come along every day. It was time to buckle down for the final four frames or wonder just when your next chance might come along.

Six balls later, he had the six strikes required for a 224 game and 814 county series record, besting 804s by Scott Voeks (twice) and Shawn Jorgenson.

As impressive as his start was, it was Cuculi's finishing flourish that put the exclamation point on his series. When the lane conditions toughened in game three, he found the pocket under pressure to once again secure the top spot in Door County bowling annals.
